ACLS PROGRAM

Advanced Cardiac Life Support Re-Certification

This program will cover the latest guidelines from the American Heart Association relating to management of cardiovascular emergencies in the office, including Acute Coronary Syndromes, Cardiac Arrest Management, Airway Management, and the use of Defibrillators. The program will review ACLS pharmacology and algorithms, then participants will progress through patient management scenarios. Those who complete the course and successfully pass the written exam will be granted a two-year certificate from the American Heart Association.

ANESTHESIA PROGRAM

Office-based Ambulatory Anesthesia

The seminar will take a look at the significant changes that have occurred within anesthesia and their impact on oral and maxillofacial surgery over the past 30 years. In exploring and discussing the various drugs, techniques, and monitoring that have been discussed in the anesthesia, OMFS and related literature we will ask ourselves various questions such as: how are we doing, are we setting a standard of care, have we or have we not incorporated such a drug, technique or monitoring device into our practice.

Dr. Bennett is currently professor and chair of the Department of Oral Surgery and Hospital Dentistry at Indiana University School of Dentistry. He received his DMD in 1984 from the University of Pennsylvania, his anesthesia certificate from the Medical College of Pennsylvania and his OMFS certificate from Long Island Jewish Medical Center. He is a diplomate of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery. Dr. Bennett has published and spoken extensively nationally and internationally on anesthesia and medicine in dentistry. He is co-editor of the WB Saunders text *Medical Emergencies in Dentistry* and is the anesthesia section editor of the *Journal of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery*. He is anesthesia section editor and associate chair of the OMMSAT. He has served on numerous committees including the AAOMS faculty section and CRET. He is past president of the ADSA and the CSOMS.

OMSNIC SEMINAR

OMSNIC's seminar, Risk Management for the Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeon, is a four-hour lecture designed for oral and maxillofacial surgeons and residents. OMSNIC's tandem-speaker team presents implant, anesthesia, and failure to diagnose cases with serious, sometimes fatal outcomes, to highlight what can be done differently to avoid such situations in your own practice. Regulatory general risk management and timely issues, such as legal aspects of cone beam CT imaging, are discussed so you have the most up-to-date information on current issues affecting you and your colleagues. The seminar has no prerequisites.

At the conclusion of this seminar, attendees will be able to:

- Identify common errors made as a result of systems failure and use the information to prevent exposure to future lawsuits
- Be aware of the areas that lead to problems in failure to diagnose cases
- Understand the impact of clinical documentation on patient care
- Recognize the effect of informed consent issues on claims
- Become familiar with legal issues connected with cone beam CT scanners
- Implement appropriate anesthesia management to maintain quality patient care
- Learn the techniques to appropriately deal with disappointed patients
